What is the STILL program? Our program invites senior volunteers (55+) into our classrooms once a week for one month to teach skills such as knitting, crocheting, baking, painting and more. Interested students who sign up get to enjoy learning invaluable life lessons during their lunch recesses.

How large are the class sizes?

Class sizes are capped at 15 students. If interest in a class is larger than expected, the volunteer is asked if the class size can increase or if interest in a second class is an option.

How is the program funded?


Seniors Teaching Invaluable Life Lessons
