REPORT CARDS

This year, parents and guardians will continue to access report cards through PowerSchool—simply log in to your account and click on the "Report Card" button in the lefthand sidebar. Like the previous report card, students will still be assessed on a Learner Attributes Scale and Achievement Scale. Some categories continue to be modified to align with the new curriculum. Progress report will be issued online on **Friday December 1, 2023**, around 3PM.



INCLEMENT WEATHER

With the winter season almost here, we want to remind families to dress children appropriately for the weather when getting ready for school or the bus. The weather often changes unexpectedly throughout the day, so please select suitable outerwear, and ensure your child is prepared for changing conditions.

If inclement weather conditions occur, Elk Island Public Schools (EIPS) advises families of any bus cancellations using various communications tools, which may include automated-telephone messages, alerts posted on **www.eips.ca** and school websites, through the Bus Status app, Twitter, Facebook and on Versatrans My Stop. Morning bus cancellations are posted on **www.eips.ca** by 6:30 a.m.

Decisions regarding bus cancellations are guided by EIPS administrative procedures that states, "school bus service may be suspended...when Environment Canada reports a temperature of -40 C." Other reasons for suspending or delaying school bus services include adverse weather and road conditions. When school bus services are suspended, schools remain open to students. EIPS believes families have the right and responsibility to make choices for their children based on their beliefs and perceptions of safety during times of inclement weather. FIRST NATIONS. METIS & INUIT EDUCATION

On September 29, we recognized the National Day for Truth & Reconciliation with a special assembly. Many students and staff wore orange shirts and learned about the history of residential schools in Canada throughout the week.

This year, our students and staff will be learning more about the Seven Sacred Teachings - Love, Wisdom, Respect, Truth, Humility, Honesty, and Courage. October's focus was on learning about the gift of Respect, which is represented by the buffalo. Each class explored what respect looks like, feels like, and sounds like and created a definition to share with the rest of the school through our daily announcements. Our Grade 6 classes shared what they learned at our special Respect assembly, which was held at the end of the month.

In November we will learn about the teaching of the Eagle - Love. We will also be starting our Turtle Islanders group again to share some cultural teachings, try a little bit of nêhiyawêwin (Cree), as well as invite a couple of visitors to share their knowledge and teachings.
